Potomac Charter

The dates of the flight to Europe organized by Potomac Region have been changed. The flight (Cabena) will now leave Dulles Airport on Friday evening, October 5 and arrive in Frankfurt, Germany around noon of the following day. The return flight will leave Amsterdam on Saturday, October 20 for Dulles. The airfare is \$182.50 per person round trip, plus applicable airport taxes.

This is not a tour. While in Europe, you will be free to travel as you wish. The Porsche factory in Stuttgart, of course, is a must for PCAers. For the bachelors, incidentally, there are a number of single girls already signed up to go.

You will need a passport, of course. This can be obtained at the Passport Agency, 401 N. Broad, Philadelphia. Take along two passport photos, a notarized copy of your birth certificate, an ID card with your signature on it and a check for \$12.

President's Message

What is happening in PCA National? The 1973 Parade! The 1974 Parade! These are just two of the topics discussed at the Zone Two President's Meeting held at Allegheny Region's Parts Swap Meet and Concours in May.

The purpose of the meeting was to try to move the club forward through the combined efforts of the eleven region Presidents in our Zone by discussing those topics which are most relevant to this end. The discussions and any decisions are then to be passed on to PCA National through our Zone Representative, Jim Perrin. It was unfortunate, however, that only slightly more than half of the regions were represented.

One of the primary topics was how to involve the new members of the club. It seems that this is a universal problem and one that is most difficult to solve. We know from personal experience that few new faces appear at our events. Possibly the unfamiliarity with our events is the underlying cause. Perhaps each region should try to enlighten its new members to the many facets of the club. Such is our intention with the new 'Riesentoter Story' booklet that we have planned to prepare.

One of the most current and worthwhile projects discussed is the development of a strong rapport with the Porsche-Audi distributors. Meetings have been held in the Ohio area with good results and steps are being

taken to hold similar talks with PAD in Valley Forge. We're hoping to possibly establish a program similar to one on the West coast wherein the distributor donates the discontinued parts to PCA for sale! This involves thousands of dollars worth of new parts for 356 and 900 cars which the factory labels obsolete. It may be just the parts you need for your car!

The controversial issue of non-member Parade guests eliminating a PCA member from consideration for Overall Parade competitions was discussed at length. Those present were in agreement that a guest should not disqualify a member entrant from Overall. However, if the guest should be a rally 'expert' brought in for the sole purpose of winning Overall, then the member should be disqualified.

Another problem we discussed is a direct result of the growth of the club. As the regions grow and develop a wide range of activities, they try to stretch out and hold multi-regional events. This has resulted in conflicts of dates for these events. The Zone Calendar has been created so that with careful planning it will be possible to attend most of these outstanding weekends in our zone.

I feel that these were the most important topics covered. As with any meeting, its worth can only be measured by what changes or ideas are then adopted. It will be interesting to note, during the coming months, how much of what we discussed becomes reality.

Why don't we...?


Before all you questionnaire haters out there decide to throw this out - think for a minute. Membership is now over 300 and the interests of Porsche freaks vary widely.



Porsche Pit Stop

In the 4 races entered so far this year by the Carrera, Peter Gregg was part of all the winning teams. But the Trans-Am at Lime Rock proved his downfall - with his co-driver Sam Posey at the wheel. Gregg had handed the car over to Posey with a slim lead during a routine pit stop at half distance. Posey drove the rest of the way keeping a sharp eye out for Al Holbert, whom he considered his biggest threat. But Milt Minter in another Carrera, driving with a hot foot and a keen eye through the heavy traffic, slipped by Posey on the last lap to win, with Posey apparently not really knowing what was happening to him.

Al Holbert had a frustrating day despite his excellent 3rd place finish. Qualifying 5th, less than a second off the pace, a number of irritating incidents resulted in less than 100% concentration in his driving efforts. As a result, Al drove at too slow a pace in the early going, made up some of the time with an excellent pit stop, but then found himself

driving too hard the last half of the race, spinning out a couple of times and being back 30 seconds at the finish. You can be sure that he learned a few things and will be completely ready for the next Trans-Am, June 16th at Watkins Glen.

In the Under 2 Liter class, Mike and Dieter were having an excellent day in their 911S. They qualified 5th in class with car and drivers performing perfectly. The only problem occurred during the pre-race warm-up, when an auxiliary oil cooler sprung a leak. With no time left to replace the unit, they simply disconnected it and coupled the braided oil lines together. Having installed a similar unit in the opposite fender just the week before proved to be the saving factor as the oil temp only ran 30 degrees hotter during the race. The combination of their 11th Overall and 2nd in class finish as well as a perfectly running car proved to be one of their most gratifying and financially rewarding races to date.
