# Meeting Notice

The September meeting of Riesentoter Region, PCA will be held at 8:30 p.m. at the Springfield Hotel, Flourtown. It's on the east side of Bethlehem Pike, 2 miles north of route 422 (just north of the railroad tracks), with plenty of parking in the shopping center just north of the Hotel on the same side of the street.

After presentation of the slate of officers for the 1979 election, to be held at the October meeting, a slide presentation will be offered. This is the time to get your name onto the roster for the 1979 election. For some months the duties and tasks of putting out <u>Der Gasser</u> have been under scrutiny. With enough work to keep several people busy, the need for reorganization has been recognized.

Cornered at a recent PCA meeting John English, Editor of <u>Der Gasser</u>, revealed his plan. Two members, John Heckman and Jim Brody, have agreed to provide staff assistance. Unfortunate it was, said English, that neither volunteered for the Editor slot. "Even though the job will be easier now, I think <u>Der Gasser</u> should have a new Editor for 1979--two years is long enough."

English explained that he has divided <u>Der Gasser</u> duties into three relatively logical groups: copy, circulation, and editorial.

Jim Brody will be the new Copy Manager responsible primarily for, strangely enough, preparation of the material (copy) to be printed. He will solicit articles from members, edit & prepare the copy suitable for publication, and determine layout instructions for the printer.

John Heckman will be the new Circulation Manager, responsible for mailing mechanics, advertising accounts, and general accounting.

The Editor continues to have overall responsibility for the publication, working closely with the Managers to produce <u>Der Gasser</u> on schedule and to maintain consistently high standards.

All three positions will be responsible for producing articles of interest to the membership, either by solicitation from officers and members or by writing them from scratch.

Asked about the Editor's position, English asserted that it is time for new blood, and that he's noticed a decline in his enthusiasm and a staleness of ideas lately. "One tends to get comfortable in such a position, and it becomes 'just a job,' then just distress in the lower tract. I don't believe that last stage has been reached yet, but it might have by now except for the substantial relief offered by Jim and John."

English said he hopes someone will agree to assume the Editor's position in time for consideration at the October election, both for his sake and Der Gasser's.

### HELPFUL HARRASSMENT

Some of you may remember that, at a recent Riesentoter meeting, Dick and Connie Sweigart were asking members to sign a petition urging changes in proposed legislation which could materially effect hillclimbing (present wording would in essence make use of all (any) public highways illegal for purposes of any form of racing, even controlled events such as those sponsored by PHA).

As a result of our interest and harrassment in the form of the petition requesting a rational approach to highway safety, Dick and Connie have received word from State Senator Edward L. Howard that the language in Section 3367 of House Bill 1171 is presently being worked on, and that if the bill is reported out of the Transportation Committee before the ent of this legislative Session, amendments are intended.

While not to diminish the efforts of PCA at the national level through Bob Rassa and others, it appears that we should make certain that those at the local level who are in a position to control the fate of competitive driving, such as our friendly State politicians, should be directly confronted by local Club members when existing or pending legislation is irrational. It seems that they <u>do</u> listen to reason.
