Riesentoter has obtained exclusive use of this nationally-known quarter-mile drag strip for the morning of Saturday August 15.

Our program will be NHRA "E.T. Bracket Racing", one of today's most popular forms of drag racing. It is traditional, tournament-style drag racing, where two contestant vehicles are paired off to race. The two contestants are matched according to their respective elapsed time (E.T.) performances in practice runs. The race is handicapped by the differential between the two drivers' E.T.'s to ensure equitable win opportunities, despite differences in performance potential of the vehicles. Therefore, it is a test of driving skill.

Timing and scoring will be done by professional track officials.

You will also have the opportunity to stay and see Maple Grove's normal afternoon drag racing program if you wish.

Maple Grove Raceway is located 10 miles south of Reading, Pa., approximately 5 miles from the Pa. Turnpike. Travel time from the Valley Forge/King of Prussia area is 45 minutes.

PRO SOLO REVISITED

A few years ago when we tried this game, the car wasn't up to snuff and neither were the drivers. This year, the blue car is dialed in.

Since Melody couldn't spare the vacation time, I towed the 900 miles to Milwaukee to see how dialed in this driver is. A few ideas were reinforced for me out there - like, don't give up, and don't be afraid to change your line, and that it's a game of inches. For those unfamiliar with Pro

For those unfamiliar with Pro Solo, it is an autocross in which you start side by side with a competitor at drag race style Christmas tree lights, and run Your best mirror image courses. time from each side is combined for your run time. You practice Saturday, run on Sunday and then the top two or three cars in each class run in a single elimination Handicap Challenge. This is really interesting because the slower cars get a head start based on the difference in the class-winning times. They pay money for this, hence the name.

Scott Holley has a 911 very similar to ours, drives it well and just recently won his class and then the Handicap Challenge at Memphis. He was the yardstick I was using.

After the first practice session, he was ahead by 0.1 second on combined times. I was using the big Hoosiers and they felt great, but I tried the Comp/TAR1 in the afternoon and ran almost identical times. The difference was that with the smaller diameter R1s I was running on the rev limiter in two places - and Holley was ahead by 0.7. After deciding to run the Hoosiers I took another long look at the courses. Though they were mirror images, they were not identical and the left side was very bumpy in some sections. I decided to take the optional slalom

differently on the left side.

Well, after 2 runs on Sunday morning, I was ahead by 0.3, a one second swing. One run on each side in the afternoon would decide it. Holley didn't talk much after that. He did run a little faster, but only on one side. My margin of victory was something like 0.05 seconds combined. (I haven't seen the official times at this writing.)

Only then did I think about the Handicap Challenge. The guys that do this a lot know all the angles and sandbagging while winning your class is the best way to approach it if you can. I just couldn't get into all the time differentials, figuring out who I could beat, and how much I should slack off if I was ahead. I decided to go as fast as I could so I wouldn't be embarrassed and let the sandbaggers fall where they might.

I drew Shane Noonan (CSP Honda) for the first round, Bruce Wentzel (Prepared 1 Vette) for the second, Chuck Noonan (CSP), Wayne Snyder (Prepared 2 Spitfire) and Duane Dunham (Prepared 2 Spitfire). That was it. There were only five rounds. And I won them all.

The final run against Dunham provided the most drama, I suppose. On the first run, he hit a cone early, and I hit a cone near the end (the only one all weekend). When we lined up for the final run the announcer said there was a .003 seconds between us. I ran probably my best run - and he missed a gear and quit. Lucky? I don't think so. The chips were down and he blinked.


